




Maximizing the value of AI for legal bill review

The legal bill review process is time-consuming, error-prone, and relies heavily on taking time away from attorneys whose jobs increasingly focus on driving business value, not just legal value.




Top legal bill review challenges that AI improves

Key vendor considerations for AI-powered legal bill review

Experience with AI and data science

AI and data science essentially fall into the same category of technology and can often overlap one another, but the application of each is different.

Data science uses scientific methods, processes, machine learning algorithms, and systems to extract knowledge and insights from structured and unstructured data. It applies knowledge and actionable insights from data across a broad range of application domains.

Artificial intelligence refers to the simulation of human intelligence in machines programmed to think like humans and mimic their actions. The term may also apply to any machine that exhibits traits associated with a human mind, such as learning and problem-solving. For a data scientist, artificial intelligence is one of many tools or a procedure used for analyzing data. There are multiple ways to analyze the data. Still, artificial intelligence is used primarily because of its ability to do repetitive tasks and learn certain human behaviors and processes over time, such as pattern recognition.

Based on AI and data science's definition and the relationship between the two, your legal technology partner must be experts in data science and AI applications. 




